TO QUALIFY, YOU MUST:

- Be at least 16 years old, eligible to work in Ontario and have a social insurance number
- Be in good academic standing and have completed at least 26 credits by February and be ready to graduate in June (including all compulsory courses, literacy requirement and community hours required for your Ontario Secondary School Diploma)
- Be willing to travel to the Studio 500 Hairstylist Apprenticeship Program located in the Burnhamthorpe CI Building (at Hwy 427 and Burnhamthorpe) as well as a local Hairstylist co-op placement

PROGRAM COMPONENTS INCLUDE:

- Students attend 4 credit cooperative education starting in February
- Pre-placement and integration classes at their home school
- 8 weeks of Ministry of Training level 1 APP in-school training at Burnhamthorpe CI Studio 500
- TTC transportation provided

The Toronto District School Board, The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU), and the Studio 500 Hairstylist Apprenticeship program located at Burnhamthorpe CI, offer this opportunity for students who are interested in pursuing a career as a hairstylist.

Upon graduation, OYAP ends and you must find paid work in the industry as a regular, registered apprentice in order to continue your trade training and qualify for your Certificate of Qualification licensing exam.

Parents and students are encouraged to purchase insurance from insuremykids.com to cover students while at the college/union training centre and travelling time to and from.



HOW DO I APPLY FOR THIS ACCELERATED OYAP PROGRAM?

The application process for this Accelerated OYAP program is as follows:

1. Contact your guidance counsellor or co-op education teacher and complete the application using the Central Co-op Application Tool by early November. Ensure that you are enrolled in 4-credit co-op for semester 2. You will be contacted via your TDSB email address to upload your resume and cover letter.
2. You will be interviewed by a team that includes representatives from the Toronto District School Board and the partnering training delivery agent (e.g., instructors from a college or training centre). At your interview, you will be assessed on the following:
 - Communication skills
 - Personal presentation
 - Basic math skills
 - Motivation
 - Attitude
 - Attendance

Students, parents, and teachers are strongly encouraged to attend the information session for this program. WHAT IS APPRENTICESHIP?

- Apprenticeship is a post-secondary education and training program for people who want to work in the skilled trade professions and who enjoy learning by doing
- 90% of apprenticeship training is acquired through hands-on instruction that employers provide at the workplace
- 10% is classroom instruction that usually takes place at a community college or an approved training organization
- An apprenticeship typically takes from 2-5 years to complete, depending on the profession
- An apprentice becomes a skilled professional called a journeyman when he/she receives a Certificate of Qualification. This happens once the apprentice has completed 100% of the training (in-school and work-based) and passed the Certificate of Qualification examination.

WHAT IS OYAP (THE ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM)?

In most cases, an apprentice must have a high school diploma before beginning an apprenticeship. The exception is the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP). OYAP is a special program that promotes careers in the skilled professions to high school students. OYAP allows you to earn credits towards your high school diploma while you gain experience and knowledge at an apprenticeship placement. For some careers, the Toronto District School Board offers centrally coordinated Accelerated OYAP programs as well as specialized tech studies /co-op OYAP programs and regular Co-op OYAP programs.

Students are encouraged to consult with their parent(s), guidance counsellor and/or cooperative education teacher as they complete the application and prepare for the interview.



WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL, OYAP STUDENTS:

- Must travel to a specific training location assigned by the MCTU for the apprenticeship classes
- Do not pay tuition fees for these in-school sessions
- Are provided with tools of the trade during the program
- May be required to purchase personal protective equipment and/or specialized clothing
- Develop skills recognized within the specific industry
- Earn credits towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma
